Is your fashion free from human trafficking?

I am a regular customer of your local store inand I am writing because
I am concerned about human trafficking in the cotton supply chain.
Did you know that young girls are targeted and trafficked to work in factories spinning, weaving
and dyeing cotton in Tamil Nadu, India? Recruited under false promises of a good job, the reality
is very different. They are forced to work for 12 hours a day for 6 or 7 days a week. As young as
14, these girls are vulnerable to sexual and physical abuse, have limited contact with their
families, and work in dangerous conditions, resulting in a wide variety of injuries and illnesses.
In almost all cases, these girls never receive the money they have been promised.
I am writing to urge you to take action to help end this practice by:
 Mapping and reporting on your cotton supply chain
 Committing to STOP THE TRAFFIK's Make Fashion Traffik-Free Protocol
I would like to be able to buy your clothes knowing they are free from human trafficking.
