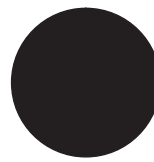

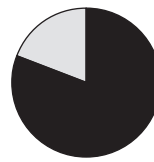
Human trafficking is a form of modern slavery—a multi-billion-dollar criminal industry that denies freedom to 40.3 million people around the world.

And no matter where you live, chances are it's happening nearby.

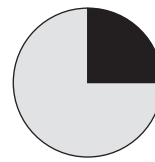
From the girl forced into prostitution in a hotel room, to the man discovered in a restaurant kitchen, stripped of his passport and held against his will. All trafficking victims share one essential experience: the loss of freedom.

THE FACTS

- The International Labor Organization estimates that forced labor and human trafficking is a \$150 billion industry worldwide.
- The U.S. Department of Labor has identified 148 goods from 75 countries made by forced labor.
- In 2016 an estimated 1 out of 7 endangered runaways reported to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children were likely child sex trafficking victims.
 - ▶ Of those 88% were in the care of social services or foster care when they ran.
- There is no official estimate of the total number of human trafficking victims in the U.S. Polaris estimates that the total number of victims nationally reaches into the hundreds of thousands when estimates of both adults and minors and sex trafficking and labor trafficking are aggregated.

STATISTICS FROM THE NATIONAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING HOTLINE AND POLARIS BEFREE TEXTLINE

- More than 49,000 total cases of human trafficking have been reported to the Hotline in the last 10 years.

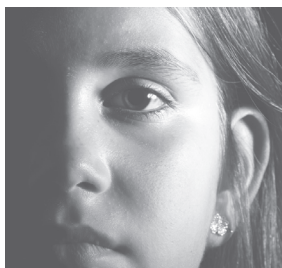
