WHY DO WE HAVE THIS SPECIAL SUNDAY?

What is modern slavery and human trafficking (MSHT)? The Salvation Army is deeply committed to responding to modern slavery and human trafficking. We have a theological and historical mandate. We believe prayer is foundational and a unique way The Salvation Army responds towards a world free from exploitation. Modern slavery arises as a result of economic, social, cultural, and legal conditions that create a state of vulnerability in which those who are enslaved find themselves. Today, there are more than 40 million men, women and children worldwide impacted by modern slavery and human trafficking. Among these, more than 15 million are in forced marriages, more than 24 million are in forced labour situations and about 30 per cent of those exploited are children.



HOW IS THE SALVATION ARMY RESPONDING GLOBALLY?

We are actively responding to modern slavery and human trafficking in 108 countries through our eight focus action areas: Prayer, Prevention, Participation, Protection, Prosecution, Partnership, Policy and Proof. Every territory/country has a contact person dedicated to growing the work in these areas and we invite you to join the response. In 2021, we served and journeyed with 9,795 survivors.

- 'Way Maker' (Light in the darkness, my God that is who you are)

I stand with frontline practitioners, advocating for the freedom of victims of oppression and walking alongside survivors. I acknowledge you.


I lament for the ways I have knowingly and unknowingly contributed to modern slavery and human trafficking through my ignorance, my privilege and my spending power.

PRAYER IN ACTION

Here are some other ideas for how you and your corps can participate in honouring this day beyond the Sunday service:

- · Organise a prayer community walk
- Invite your community to a human trafficking prevention Bible study/small group
 - » You could do this physically if restrictions allow, or in small groups. You could also do this over WhatsApp, Zoom, Facebook or another online platform
 - » Remember that you can adapt materials to suit your community! Please reach out if you need support with this.
- Host an awareness event that addresses the roots causes to human trafficking in your community. Invite your territorial/national contact person to share what's being done in your territory/country and discuss ways you and your corps can get involved.
